JOINT COMMITIEE ON PUBLIC EMPLOYEE RETIREMENT FIRST QUARTER MEETING JANUARY 19, 2012

The Joint Committee on Public Employee Retirement held its 1st Quarter Meeting on Thursday, January 19, 2012 at 8:00 am in House Hearing Room 1. With a quorum being established, Representative Atkins called the meeting to order. Joint Committee members in attendance were Senators Keaveny, Lamping, and Rupp and Representatives Anders, Atkins, Brown, Franz, Pierson and Wieland. Senators Chappelle-Nadal, Crowell, and Green were not in attendance.

Representative Atkins turned the meeting over to the Executive Director, Ronda Stegmann. The 2012 Annual Report to the General Assembly relative to plan year 2010 was reviewed. There are currently 126 public retirement plans reporting annual information to the JCPER. Specific trends for plan year 2010 reporting included a decrease in active membership by over 3,000 marking the second time in a 5 year period that this membership has declined. The market value of assets grew by over \$4 billion to \$48.1 billion with actuarial value of assets equaling \$55.7 billion and actuarial accrued liabilities equaling \$71.8 billion. Plan year 2010 net investment income exceeded \$5.8 billion after 2 consecutive years of negative investment experience. Twelve plans decreased the investment rate of return assumption in plan year 2010. Benefit payments increased by \$172 million although this increase was not at prior years' level of increases which often resulted in increases exceeding \$200 million annually.

Preliminary reporting of 10 plans for plan year 2011, indicates a net investment income in excess of \$8 billion and an aggregate funded ratio of 80% on a market value basis and 81% on an actuarial value basis.

The Director reviewed pension legislation introduced for the current session. There are currently 18 pension bills being monitored by the JCPER, seven of which pertain to retirement benefits for General Assembly members or State Elected Officials. Representative Aktins inquired as to provisions in Senate Bill 581 which require the Joint Committee to contract with an actuary to do a financial report and actuarial audit of the Kansas City Public School Retirement System. The Director indicated staff is working with the bill sponsor's staff to address concerns associated with this provision including potential costs of approximately \$35,000.

It was noted quarterly reporting was not included in the member packets due to the timing of the meeting but will be forwarded when complete.

No further business being presented, the committee adjourned.




